Success stories

In the current government "Prosperity for All" programme, PLHIV are normally left out due to stigma and discrimination. Following the sub county community dialogues, PLHIV brought their challenges to the attention of the Sub County Community Development Officer. This advocacy has led to Buyinja & Busaali S/County PLHIV networks in Namayingo benefiting from the District Community Driven Development Grant (CDD). Buyinja sub county invested the money in oxen (animal traction: 03 cows) which is a step towards supporting PLHIV efforts on increased food production and income generation. Buswale PLHIV Forum invested the fund in a saloon out of which they are supporting 03 OVCs in a private a school (St Otwomo Primary School). The three children who would have otherwise dropped out of school are children of the fallen (late) PLHIV.
